- 1. A Reconciliation Walk: Every Child Matters. This series, presented by the deacons of Parkdale-West Toronto deanery, with the assistance of the National Film Board, continues on Thursday, November 4, 2021 at 7:30 p.m. Join Bishop Riscylla Shaw and award-winning Indigenous filmmaker Alanis Obomsawin for a discussion of Ms. Obomsawin's film "We Can't Make the Same Mistake Twice." This monumental documentary follows a historic court case filed by the Assembly of First Nations and the Child and Family Caring Society of Canada against the federal government, exposing generations of injustices endured by First Nations children living on reserves and their families. Through passionate testimony and unwavering conviction, frontline childcare workers and experts including Cindy Blackstock take part in a decade-long court battle to ensure these children receive the same level of care as other Canadian children. Advocating for Inclusionary Zoning in Toronto: The city's draft Inclusionary Zoning (IZ) policy was considered at Planning and Housing Committee last week, where Social Justice & Advocacy staff made a presentation in favour of higher set-aside rates. The policy will go to City Council for a vote on November 9 and 10. ## November 7, Pentecost 24
