The Baptismal Covenant

Let us join together and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ? **I will, with God's help.**

The Baptism

The candidate is presented to the celebrant who pours water upon him saying,

Sijin George, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Using chrism, the celebrant makes the sign of the cross on his forehead saying,

I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The celebrant, at a place in the full sight of the congregation, prays over the newly baptized, saying,

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace.

Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

The Giving of the Light

The celebrant then gives a lighted candle to the newly baptized, saying,

Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We receive you into the household of God.

**Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection,
and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**
